



Trey started playing chess when he was 4 years old. During his time in the Shaker Heights school system he won two Queen City Classic tournaments in Cincinnati (2007 and 2008), and two high school grade level championships (10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade). He led his high school team to two second place finishes, and to a tie for first place in 2011. Trey has competed in various locations including Las Vegas, Dallas, Chicago, Orlando, and Nashville (SuperNationals). He earned his National Master title in October 2016.

Trey earned a chess scholarship to attend Texas Tech University from 2011-2016 where he played under Susan Polgar for one year, and US Open Champion Alexander Onischuk from 2012-2016. Trey competed in numerous Texas national and team tournaments as well as the annual Pan American Intercollegiate Team Chess Championship. He also served as President of the Knight Raiders chess club of Texas Tech from 2013-2016 where he coordinated team travel to national tournaments, coordinated student travel to recruiting events at national high school tournaments, and ran tournaments in Lubbock and Plainview, Texas. He also helped organize the 2013 Pan American in Lubbock.

Trey earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Exercise and Sport Sciences in May 2016. He is currently enrolled at Cleveland State University, and will begin CSU's Doctor of Physical Therapy program in January 2018.

Trey has played trumpet since 5<sup>th</sup> grade, and has played in the Shaker Heights community band each year since 2011. In high school he played in the marching band, Wind Ensemble and Jazz Ensemble, and served as a Field Commander during his senior year. He also started on Shaker Heights High School's varsity baseball team for two seasons winning the Lake Erie League All-League Honor Award in 2010 and co-Offensive MVP. Trey has also played on the Ohio Warriors summer baseball travel team each year since 2005.
